## Water System Maintenance PLANNED WATER SYSTEM SHUTDOWN Wednesday, September 15, 2021

This notice is to inform all Scott Lake property owners and residents that we will be performing planned maintenance on the water system which will require a partial system shutdown. This shutdown will impact all properties in the front half of the Scott Lake Community. Enclosed is a list of streets that we do not anticipate will lose water service during this shut down. This list also identifies where work will be taking place. The intent of this notice is to be informative and allow those in affected areas time to prepare for loss of water service. If you have renters, please pass this information along.

## <mark>WATER <u>WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE</u> ON</mark>

## WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 15, 2021, BEGINNING AT 8:00 AM.

## Please DO NOT continue to try to use water after 8:00 AM. Continued use of water will drain any pressurized areas that are shut down and result in increased issues with sediment.

- Prepare in advance by staging buckets of water to refill your toilet to flush as needed while the system is shut down.
- Prepare in advance by having stored drinking water or bottled water for consumption. It is recommended for emergency preparedness to always have a stored supply of drinking water.
- Sediment will be disrupted during the system work and discolored water is to be expected. Run outside water to resolve this issue. Continued attempts to use water during the shutdown will worsen sediment issues.
- A precautionary Boil Water Advisory will be active following water service restoration and will remain in
  effect until lab results are returned confirming that the water is clear from contaminants. It is anticipated
  that results will be returned within 24-48 hours. <u>The Boil Water Advisory is applicable to all customers
  and all areas of the system.</u>
- Notification will be provided once the Boil Water Advisory is lifted.

We thank you for your continued patience, understanding and cooperation while we continue to work through maintenance projects to update the water system. The ongoing scheduled maintenance is imperative to ensure continued functionality of our aging water system. Many of the existing components of the water system have surpassed their useful life expectancy which poses an even greater need to continue scheduled maintenance. Components that have surpassed their life expectancy create an increased risk of ongoing problems, leaks, and potentially catastrophic failure of the system. Ensuring that we move forward with each scheduled project in a preventative approach, helps reduce the likelihood that we will face a failure of the water system requiring an

emergency response that could result in severe impacts and long-term outages of water service to the community. This ongoing maintenance is vital for continued operations and ensuring that we provide safe and healthy drinking water to our residents, which is of the utmost importance.
