THE SPEED LIMIT THROUGHOUT SCOTT LAKE IS 25 MPH

Please remind your friends and young adults who will be driving through our community to adhere to the speed limit of 25 mph. Speeding is a violation of the law and can result in significant financial loss and increase the likelihood of accidents. Children are often involved in speeding accidents due to their unpredictable movements. Cars are more challenging to control at high speeds, and it takes longer to slow down, reducing your reaction time to changes in weather and traffic conditions. Always pay attention to speed limit signs; if you are uncertain about the speed limit, slow down to match the speed of other cars. Going slightly slower than the rest of the traffic is a prudent way to avoid trouble.

Keep Your Water Meter Clear

Please make sure your water meter is clear of debris and/or vegetation. Do not pile dirt, plant landscaping, park vehicles over, place pots or lawn ornaments on top of the meter box, allow vegetation to overgrow, or prevent access to the meter.

If the SLMC meter reader cannot read the meter due to the meter being inaccessible, the property owner will receive a notice to please clear it before the next meter read. If it is not cleared by the next read time, the property owner may be charged a \$50 fine per the SLMC fee schedule. Meter reads occur between the 15th and 21st of each month.

Checking for leaks

Have a high water bill? Common household leaks can waste up to 10,000 gallons of water per year. Typical leaks include dripping faucets, worn toilet flappers and broken supply or irrigation lines.

For Paperless SLMC Billing & Online Payments

Please call the Northwest Water Service office (360-876-0958) to request paperless billing.

To view and make payments online, the website is www.ub-pay.com. The municipality code is NWScottLake, the customer will need this to create an account, but will only need the login and password after set up.

There is a convenience fee for online payments. The fee is \$3.00 per hundred dollars, i.e. 0-\$100: \$3.00 / \$101-\$200: \$6.00 / \$201 - \$300: \$9.00 / etc.
