- ALL guests must be accompanied by the Scott Lake property owner or resident at all times.
- No Lifeguard on duty – swim at your own risk.
- Youths under 14 must be accompanied by an adult in the swimming area.
- Pets must be on a lease at all times.
- No unauthorized motorized vehicles are allowed in the park.
- Alcohol, marijuana, and illegal substances are strictly prohibited.
- By order of the Board of Trustees, anyone causing damage or engaging in endangering behavior may be suspended from park privileges.

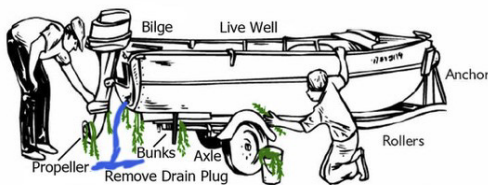

PSE Bill Assistance

Many people face challenges keeping up with energy costs. If you're struggling with your energy bill, PSE bill assistance programs could help.

Bill Discount Rate (BDR)

PSE's Bill Discount Rate (BDR) program provides you with ongoing help on your monthly energy bill. Depending on your household income and size, you can save 5% to 45% monthly on your bill.

PSE Home Energy Lifeline Program (HELP)

Paying bills can be stressful, but PSE is there to help. PSE's Home Energy Lifeline Program (HELP) is designed to help residential customers pay their electric or natural gas bills. They'll credit your account for up to \$1,000 if you qualify, significantly relieving your energy costs.

PREPARING FOR AN EMERGENCY

Individuals should have three key things: get an emergency supply kit, make a family emergency plan, and be informed about the different types of emergencies that could occur and appropriate responses. Everyone should have some basic supplies to survive several days of an emergency. This list of emergency supply kit items listed below is only a starting point. Individuals must review this list and consider their family's unique needs, including pets, for items to include. Individuals should also consider having at least two emergency supply kits, one full kit at home, and smaller portable kits in their workplace, vehicle, or other places they spend time.

- ◆Water (one gallon per person per day for several days for drinking and sanitation)
- ◆Extra cell phone battery or charger
- ◆First aid kit
- ◆Flashlight & extra batteries
- ◆Whistle to signal for help
- ◆Moist towelettes, garbage bags & ties for personal sanitation
- ◆Battery-powered radio
