# Recent Car Burglaries

We are aware of the recent reports regarding the car burglaries in the neighborhood. We would like to assure the entire community that we take this seriously. While we have budgeted, back in May, for Sheriff patrols in our neighborhood, the Sheriff's department is not yet able to offer these services. It's up to us as a community to diligently watch out for each another. If you find yourself a victim of any illegal act, please call the Sheriff's office non-emergency line @ 360-704-2740, or if you feel an immediate response is necessary, call 911. Talk to your neighbors to see if they have cameras that could garner any information on the incident. Remove anything of value from your vehicle that would be tempting to a thief. Use a motion sensor light or leave your outside lights on at night. Most importantly, lock your vehicles. Continue to notify your neighbors of illegal activity. Stay vigilant and be safe.

### **Sharing Shed/Table**

When the Sharing Table first started, it was for produce only. Over time, many community members generosity has blossomed into other food items for humans and four-legged friends.



#### Acceptable Items:

- All food items human and animal.
- Personal hygiene products: feminine hygiene, soaps, shampoos, etc.
- Household consumables include dish soap, hand soaps, laundry detergent, and other cleaning agents.

#### **Unacceptable Items:**

Household goods, such as furniture, pots and pans, and glassware. Clothing. Any non-grocery items. You can leave these things for porch pickups or out by your residence. This is not a shed for yard sale castoffs.

As a community, we all contribute to maintaining the sharing shed/table. If you add fresh perishable items to the table, like fruits and vegetables, please check the next day or two to see if they were taken. If they haven't been, please dispose of them appropriately. Let's take responsibility and not leave them to rot or for someone else to care for them.

# Sandbags are available at the Park

As winter approaches and the rains begin, SLMC has taken proactive steps to safeguard our community by delivering sandbags to the park's



south entrance, conveniently located near the golf course entrance for those who might be directionally challenged . These sandbags will enable residents to shield their homes and surrounding structures from flooding, ensuring we are better prepared for the upcoming weather challenges.



- 1. Never leave a burning candle unattended.
- 2. Turn off tree lights, decorations, and portable space heaters when away or asleep.
- 3. Never burn wrapping paper in the fireplace. Doing so could result in a flash fire because wrapping paper can ignite suddenly and burn intensely.
- 4. Use indoor and outdoor lights as indicated on their packaging.
- 5. Don't overload circuits, extension cords, or electrical sockets; this could cause a fire. Use no more than three standard-size sets of lights per single extension cord.
- 6. Never leave cooking or baking unattended.
- 7. Keep festive holiday plants out of pets' reach, including poinsettias, mistletoe, and holly.
- 8. Check your smoke detector battery. They should be tested regularly and the batteries replaced at least once or twice a year. Mark your calendars to check your alarm during the holidays.
- 9. Drive safe and be aware of your surroundings.
- 10. Choose a fire-resistant artificial tree, and water a natural tree daily.
- 11. Clean and maintain wood-burning fireplaces and chimneys.
- 12. Travel safely, and don't overshare on social media. If you travel, don't post your plans on social media, as you might unintentionally invite thieves to break into your home.
